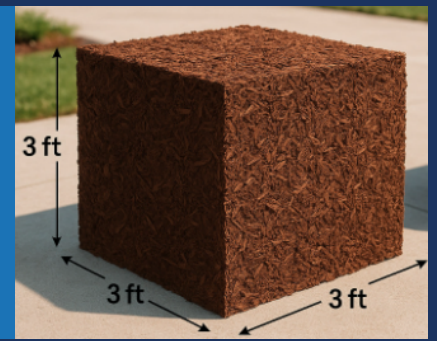


What's a cubic yard?

A cubic yard is a unit of volume equivalent to a cube with sides of one yard (or three feet) in length, width, and height.

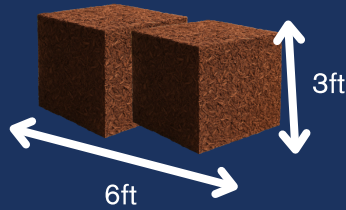


Volume

Dimension

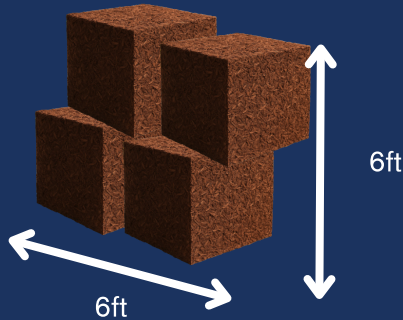
Approximate Comparable Size

2 Cubic Yards



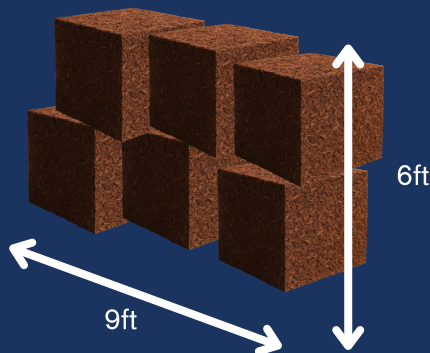
Washer and Dryer

4 Cubic Yards



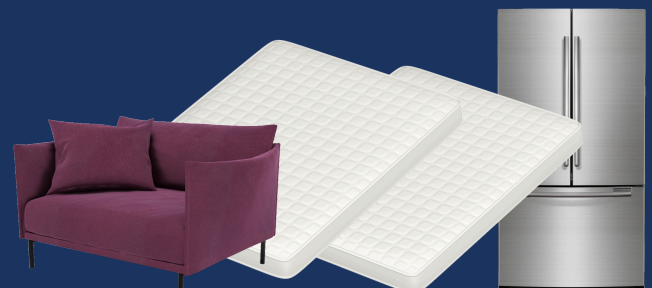
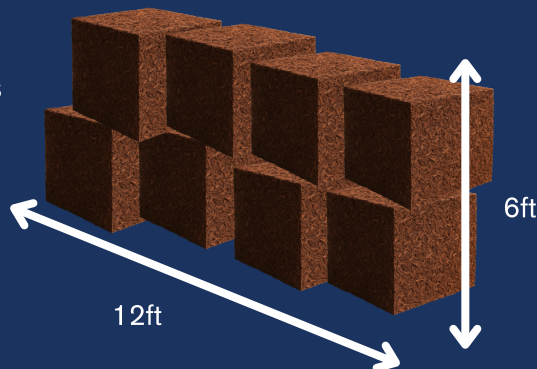
2 Dressers

What is yard waste?

Also called “green waste” or “vegetative waste”, yard waste is organic material generated from landscaping, gardening or yard maintenance. Examples include grass clippings, branches, tree limbs, palm fronds, bushes, and garden trimmings.



What is bulk waste?

Also called “bulk trash” or “large item pickup”, bulk waste is large, non-hazardous household items that are too big or too heavy to fit into a standard trash container. Examples include furniture, appliances, carpets, large toys and other oversized debris. This does NOT include construction and demolition debris, hazardous waste and automotive parts.

What is household hazardous waste?

Household hazardous waste is everyday products used in homes that contain chemicals or compounds that can be harmful to people, pets, or the environment if not disposed of properly. Examples include automotive fluids and fuel, cleaners and polishes, fertilizer, herbicides, pesticides, helium tanks, fire extinguishers, oil-based paints and paint products, rechargeable batteries, and vehicle batteries. You can dispose of these items at the **St. Lucie County Solid Waste Baling and Recycling Facility**. Most household hazardous waste is FREE of charge.
